Last month we held our Annual Meeting where we review events of the past year and outline topics to address in the forthcoming one. I think the most significant contribution to the Library was fundraising of over \$8,000 for the Children's Library. A large portion of this paid for a new door, which is to ensure the safety of children, and it was done in just a few months with support from individuals in the community. There has been other significant support from foundations and individuals, which allows BLFF to continue to provide direct support to the library in the form of programs/services to the community and media/equipment to the library. One important annual event is the volunteer appreciation luncheon. Last year, over 35 people attended, including representatives from the City of Bandon Youth Poetry Contest, established in 1997 and no surrounding communities. The Summer Reading Program began in June, and we are preparing for the summer onslaught. The theme this summer is **"Build a Better World"**. What a fun summer this will be! Let's build up our collection to help our children "Build a Better World".

July was originally the month of Quintilis in the Roman calendar. It was the fifth month of the year until January and February were added in 450 BC. July 10 - *LOVE IN THE AFTERNOON*-Audrey Hepburn, Gary Cooper-130 min.-1957-Warner Brothers-Director Billy Wilder. A middle-aged playboy becomes fascinated by the daughter of a private detective who has been hired to entrap him with the wife of a client. She gives him a dose of his own medicine!

Aug 14 - *INHERIT THE WIND*-Spencer Tracy, Gene Kelly-127 min.-1960-Metro Goldwyn Mayer-Director Stanley Kramer. Based on the famous Scopes Monkey trial of 1925 a Tennessee school teacher Bertram Cates is arrested for teaching his students Darwin's theory of evolution. The case receives national attention. The Armada is waiting for the attack on England and Thorpe surprises them with attacks on their galleons where he shows his skills with a sword.
