#### From the Director's Chair



I have been asked to explain where our Library funds come from.

These examples are based on the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year. For our purposes, a fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30. Property taxes are collected November 15, February 15, and May 15. Taxpayers may pay all by November 15, or pay in installments on those three dates.

Coos County Library Service District is a line item on your tax bill, you can see how much it is for eight libraries. These monies are distributed by the county to the fiscal agent three times a year. Our fiscal agent is the City of Bandon. For 2016-17, the amount distributed to Bandon was \$303,048.66 total. Expenditures were \$323,076.02, leaving us with a **deficit** of \$20,027.36. The City of Bandon is very cognizant of the fact that we cannot operate just on CCLSD taxes alone. Therefore, the budget for 2016-17 was \$376,921.00 and the City made up the difference. We do not spend everything in the fiscal year. Instead we are required to have a "cash carryover" because the new fiscal year starts on July 1 and taxes are not collected until November 15 and distributed in December. Normal cash carryover for the library is \$52,000+. Purchasing for the first few months of the fiscal year is kept to a minimum.

The City of Bandon property tax rate is one of the lowest in the State of Oregon: These figures are per thousand: **Bandon \$0.465**, Coquille \$6.10, Coos Bay \$6.36, Myrtle Point \$7.99, North Bend \$6.18, Powers \$7.39. As you can see, the City of Bandon gives more bang for your buck (or penny) than any city around. As you can also imagine, the City does not have extra money to throw around. We receive \$1,000 in Ready to Read funds from the Oregon State Library (we have to write the grant applying for those funds), which are used for Children's services, materials and programs.

They have digitized everything--pictures, maps, even a historic tin-can collection for you to learn from. You can visit the Kalmiopsis Wilderness and the Baumgartner Cabin or even beautiful Babyfoot Lake without getting blisters or ticks. Enjoy Peter Brett's photography, the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, pear packing, the historic Rogue River, and much more. This is an awesome website! -Rosalyn McGarva


