In my final months of an over 50-year career in libraries, I have been attempting to prepare the Bandon Public Library for the future. I have researched "the future of libraries" to see what we

I have to admit, I loved some of the items and laughed out loud at the book delivery drone. It could not stand up to our winds and our seagulls. I also loved the Mobile Library Center aka "Meet the ideas" box. Sometimes, to engage local communities or reach people in remote locations, the library would want to physically leave the library building. I'm thinking this would be a county-wide thing at all gatherings: Cranberry Festival, whale watching and any event being held in Coos County. This would bring the world of books and libraries out to the folks who may not have thought of what a library can offer them. When we take the Library to the Coos County Fair we visit with and introduce or reintroduce over 1,000 people to their local libraries and all that they offer. What a tiny investment and with a big result. North Bend Public Library already sets up in the Pony Village Mall during events and Coos Bay Library attends the Farmers Market. Short of paying for an expensive bookmobile, maybe a Mobile Library that rolls out to an event would be a real advantage. I grew up where bookmobiles were the treat of all treats; of course they were followed everywhere by the ice cream truck.

Already we are thinking outside the traditional library box with our upcoming events. On April 20<sup>th</sup> we have Earth day in the Bandon City Park which will include an Interactive Tide Pool Walk, the Kelp Forests of Oregon and Rocky Shore Ecology. On May 17<sup>th</sup>, there will be a program on Edible Seaweed, on June 13<sup>th</sup> a South Slough Hike and many other upcoming events. Don't you dare miss the wonderful event coming up on Saturday June 15 at 11:00 a.m. in the Sprague Theatre. This is the kickoff of our Summer Reading Program (for all ages), and will feature Angel Ocasio – super funny, super entertaining, super clean fun. He will remind those of us who loved Red Skeleton, Lucille Ball, Jerry Lewis, and Carol Burnett of those wonderful and fun times.
