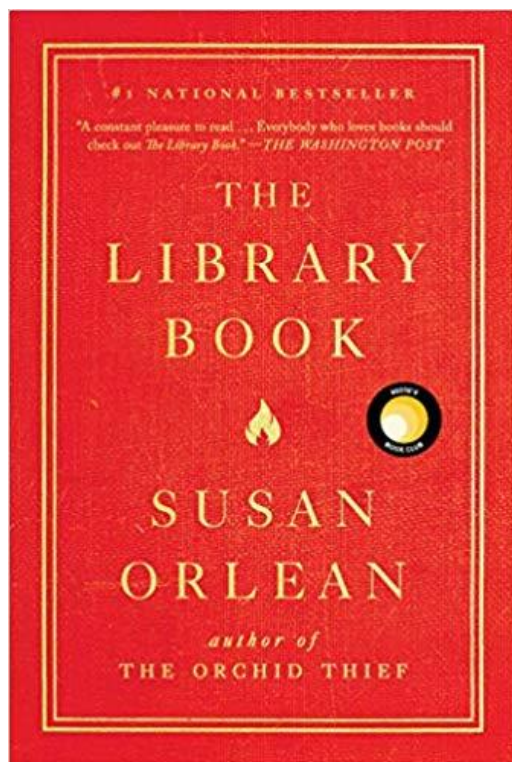


On the morning of April 28, 1986, a fire alarm sounded in the Los Angeles Public Library. The fire was disastrous: it reached 2,000° and burned for more than seven hours. By the time it was extinguished, it had consumed 400,000 books and damaged 700,000 more. More than thirty years later, the mystery remains: Did someone purposefully set fire to the library—and if so, who?
