

NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT

It feels as if the Bandon Library has awakened from a long sleep! As COVID numbers have decreased in Coos County – our hope is this trend will continue – the library has reopened to a five-days-per-week schedule: Tuesday-Thursday 12-6pm, Friday 10am-4pm, and Saturday 10am-1pm.

Final setup of the new RFID system is being completed. This system and accompanying computers were purchased by the Bandon Library Friends & Foundation, Inc. (BLFF) through a bequest from Marjorie Wilson and is being set up under the supervision of our new library director, Christine Kingsbury. It expedites checkout/check-in and allows for easier, quicker and more accurate inventorying.

Our library is partnering with the Friends of Bandon Parks (https://fobparks2.blogspot.com/) to develop a Story Walk in City Park, adjacent to the library. Story Walk is a permanent educational activity that places stories along a popular walking route in the community.

Farewell to a Dear Friend and Supporter of the BLFF

J. Merle Logan (1934-2022) was born in Pittsburgh, PA, educated at the University of Oklahoma, and taught graduate courses at Texas A & M. He also traveled, taught, and/or did research in China, Tibet, Japan, England, Scotland, Switzerland, Greece, Italy and Guatemala.

After he retired from A & M, he and Lorna moved full time to Bandon. It was then he became involved in the Bandon Library project. (Merle also continued teaching, this time at the University of Oregon, through 2016.) Having supported graduate students for years with grant money, he had the ability to raise money and eventually helped secure over four million dollars to get the library built. Merle would have stressed that a lot of people were involved in that effort for many years. After the library was built, the Bandon Library Development Foundation, Inc. and the Friends of the Bandon Public Library merged to become the BLFF. Merle served as its president until 2018.

Merle was also instrumental in establishing Bandon's Coast Community Health Clinic. Giving back to his community was an important part of who he was.


Thank you, Merle, for your dedication to learning and civic responsibility and the Bandon Library. You will be greatly missed.



The Sprague Theatre's sound system has been upgraded to provide a movie theatre-type experience. We hope this will be a fun family night that can repeated. A strong commitment is expected; each board member is elected to the BLFF Board for a three-year term. Attending BLFF Board meetings requires about 2-3 hours monthly (or quarterly). Additional assignments as a chair of volunteer for a selected BLFF activity or program are encouraged and may have additional time requirements.

Volunteer Coordinator:

The BLFF Volunteer Coordinator recruits and coordinates volunteers, working with program chairs so all events that need volunteers are covered. The Volunteer Coordinator also provides orientation training for new volunteers.
