

The BLFF and Bandon Library are again able to accept your good condition donations. Since July 1, three book sales have been held, which have brought in over \$1,500 to the Bandon Library. In addition, your purchases from the *Never-ending Book Sale* just inside the library doors have provided hours of reading pleasure and over \$1,000 to our library.

As you'll learn from reading our Library Director's article, there is a LOT going on at the Bandon Library. The BLFF was able to make a significant donation to help fund FREE programs for both children and adults. From the Director...

First, I'd like to say a quick thank you for all the BLFF's hard work over the past several months. It is wonderful to see the positive energy that all of you bring to the library and our community.

We are very close to having the collection ready for the new self-checkout station provided by the BLFF. Special thanks to all the volunteers that have been helping with this project.

The youth summer reading program was a huge success. During the month of July, the library offered 20 programs attended by a total of 570 participants. 85 youth signed up for the reading incentive program and logged over 280 hours of reading. Special thanks to Washed Ashore and Shoreline Education Awareness for their special family presentations.

Recent adult programs include monthly "*Friday Morning Free Writing*," a monthly book club hosted by the BLFF, an author talk by *Mark Yaconelli*, and a presentation by *Randal Hill* on surf music of the early 1960s, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all attendees.

The library has several new programs in the works for fall. *Washed Ashore* has teamed up with the library to offer a monthly story time and a new monthly early school age *STEAM club for kids*. We are also hosting a traveling exhibit September 27 – October 8 called "*Oregon's Dino-Story*." This will be an interactive display for all ages.

Oregon author *William Sullivan* will be giving an author talk titled "*D.B. Cooper & the Exploding Whale: Folk Heroes of the Northwest*" on October 23 at 2pm at the Sprague Theater.

Thank you BLFF for hosting this free event! Last but not least, we will be hosting a *free Celtic harp concert by Lisa Lynne and Aryeh Frankfurter* on November 8 at 7pm at the Sprague Theater.

We are excited to announce that CyberLynx has updated the library meeting rooms with new state of the art audio-visual equipment to help support online conferencing for our community. CyberLynx has done an outstanding job facilitating this project and we are so thankful to them for their generous contribution.

COMPUTER TRAINING CLASSES RESUME

Bandon Library has upgraded its computer training equipment and is scheduling monthly computer training classes. Both the Sprague Community Room and Logan/Friends Conference Room now have 75" flat screen TVs and web conferencing equipment.

Trainers can now show presentations, tutorials, and videos for training on the TV. In addition, each room has available a web conference camera with speaker and microphone. Your organization can schedule these conference rooms to hold web conference meetings. The library plans to hold training on conducting and participating in Zoom meetings and using this new equipment.

Computer training sessions will be held monthly on the 1st Thursday of every month from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. Topics will be based on online course materials from the Public Library Association's site, **http://DigitalLearn.org/courses**. Check the library's website (**http://bandonlibrary.org**) or Facebook page for monthly topics.

CyberLynx, the nonprofit organization that staffed free computer training classes pre-pandemic, has provided these upgrades to improve the library's digital training capabilities. They look forward to continuing their technology training program with the library.


August Book Sale News

Our summer book sale in August was a success after a two year hiatus. We set up late Thursday afternoon and opened at 10:00 the next morning.

Everything (books, DVDs, CDs, puzzles) was \$.50 to start with on Friday, August 5th. Saturday, August 6, was Bag Day and the remaining books were free on Sunday.

We cleared the closet and earned a total of \$948.30, of which \$50 was for memberships, \$80.30 in donations and \$818 for books. We plan to have one again next summer as the closet is filling again (already!), and this format seemed to work.
