

NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT

Library Funding Methodology (from the Bandon City Manager's Newsletter June 2024)

"The Coos County Library District's proposed library funding methodology went before the County Commission on April 23rd ... The proposed funding methodology, developed as a result of the collective effort of District libraries over the course of nearly 20 years, is based on two fundamental factors: resident population and library usage.

"The methodology is considered fair because it incentivizes libraries to develop quality programming to increase library usage. As library usage increases, so does the amount of funding received by the member library. The new allocation would be implemented slowly over a four-year period. "... the Commission elected to approve the new funding methodology for one year...

"Should you wish to express your support for the new methodology that would generate nearly 37% (\$160,000 - \$180,000) in additional library funding for the Bandon Library over the next four years, you are advised to contact the Coos County Commission (co.coos.or.us) and Library District (eso@coastlinglibrarynetwork.org) directly."

Community 101: The Community 101 group at Bandon High School has awarded us a grant in the amount of \$1,300. Community 101 grants are made possible through collaborative efforts among Oregon Community Foundation, the Ford Family Foundation, Bandon-by-the-Sea Rotary Club, and Bandon High School Leadership Program.

The Leadership Program gives students an opportunity to be involved in their community by learning about non-profit organizations, grants, and volunteerism. Students who are part of the BHS Leadership program send out grant applications to local nonprofits, evaluate all responses, visit sites

From the Director...

Youth Summer Reading is in full swing! We received special funding through our library district to provide several fun and educational youth and family programs. This year's theme is "Read, Renew, Repeat." Special summer programs include: a magician, reptile presentation, Art Day, Museum of Natural and Cultural History ocean presentation, Washed Ashore presentation, Storytime with Kevin the Dog, Sapphire Farms Storytime, Felting Workshop, Bilingual Storytime, Stuffy Sleepover, Teen Writing Workshop, Storytime with William and Malaya, Coos Art Museum crafts, and a portable planetarium. We hope to provide a welcoming place for youth and families, engaging and educational activities, and active support to keep kids reading all summer long.

The Bandon Library Friends and Foundation received a Community 101 Grant to provide an art cart and art supplies for library programming. Thank you BLFF, Bandon High School Leadership Class, the Ford Family Foundation, and Bandon Rotary for supporting library youth programs. The Bandon Library is the recipient of a one-year grant through the South Coast Regional Early Learning Hub to provide an early literacy staff member to facilitate 0-6 age library programs. The library will be offering four early literacy programs a week.

Ongoing library programs include:

Bandon Art Gallery exhibits, Chess Club (all age), Adult Chess Club, BLFF Book

Club, Preschool Storytime, Washed Ashore Storytime, Friday Freewriting, Apple Lab, drop-in board games sponsored by the BLFF, Plastic Collection, Seed Library, Storytelling Café, Windows Computer Lab, High School Hangout, 0-5 Open Play Time, Sports Checkout, and an Age Café.

During June, the library hosted the Museum of Natural and Cultural History's Native Innovation Exhibit. The Coquille Tribe was featured along with eight other tribes in Oregon. We hope to continue to provide these wonderful opportunities.

In April, the Coos County Board of Commissioners (BOC) voted in favor of year-one only of the four-year transition into the new funding model proposed by the Coos Library Board (CLB), with the intention of revisiting the issue in November. The BOC also approved the City of Coquille's request to hire an outside consultant for a second opinion on the new methodology. We are hopeful that the new funding model proposed by the CLB will be approved in November.

It is especially exciting to see so many kids and families in the library this summer. We could not do what we do without the support from the BLFF members. Thank you for your part in helping create life-long learners and a quality library experience for our whole community.



Free computer labs are available at Bandon Library. Labs are drop-in sessions where you can get help with your computer questions or problems. You can bring your own Windows PC or Apple Computer to the appropriate session. The sessions are held from 4:30 to 6:00 pm in the Logan Conference Room on the 2nd Tuesday and Wednesday of each month.

Windows Computer Labs are on 2nd Tuesdays and are staffed by volunteer Larry Baker of Computers 101. (July 9, Aug 13, Sept 10, Oct 8, Nov 12, and Dec 10)

Apple Computer Labs are held monthly on the 2nd Wednesday of the month. Aaron Barnes of Bandon IT is the volunteer instructor. (July 10, Aug 14, Sept 11, Oct 9, Nov 13, and Dec 11)
